The Pursuit of Sustainable Business Excellence by Way of Kaizen in a Food Manufacturing Company in Japan by Dr. Wayne Macpherson (Massey University, New Zealand)

The philosophy and practice of kaizen, as exemplified by the Toyota Production System and underpinning Toyota Way, is associated with Japan's industrial success. Numerous Japanese and non-Japanese companies have adopted the tools and techniques employed at Toyota in their own pursuit of economic success. However, cases of failure show that one size does not fit all – even in Japan. The Japanese food manufacturer, Japan Starch, is one such case. When senior management first decided to operationalize kaizen within the organization they adopted a Toyotainspired kaizen programme, only to abandon it after recognized failure. Management then moved to develop an in-house kaizen program – one that has proven to be very successful. This lecture will look at the events that inspired this program then unpack it to provide the means for participants to explicitly understand what kaizen is and how it is sustained within a Japanese food manufacturing company. Participants will apply their understanding to a real-world context and plan a kaizen activity program to generate real economic and noneconomic prosperity.
